## PROCLAMATION SUSPENDING OPEN BURNING AND OPEN BURNING PERMITS

Due to the early fire activity, anticipated high winds, elevated temperatures and reduced fuel moisture, all open burning and burn permits are hereby suspended in the following geographic areas pursuant to San Bernardino County Fire Protection District Ordinance §26:

- **Division 1 – All unincorporated West Valley areas, including the Cities of Fontana and Upland.**
- **Division 2 – All unincorporated East Valley areas, including the Cities of San Bernardino and Grand Terrace.**
- **Division 3 – All Mountain Areas, except for within Running Springs Fire District, and the Big Bear Fire Authority boundaries.**
- **Division 4 – All unincorporated South Desert and River Areas, including the Town of Yucca Valley, the City of 29 Palms, and the City of Needles, except for Morongo Valley.**
- **Division 5 – All unincorporated North Desert Areas, including the City of Hesperia and City of Adelanto, except for Yermo, Daggett, and Newberry Springs.**

**THIS SUSPENSION SHALL TAKE EFFECT AT 0800 HOURS FRIDAY MAY 1, 2026  
AND SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL LIFTED**

### PLEASE NOTE:

- San Bernardino County Fire Protection District requires fires be extinguished if hazardous conditions exist (such as high flames, wind-blown embers, extremely low humidity), or fires producing excessive, offensive, or objectionable smoke. ALL outdoor fires (except for propane or natural gas fueled) are prohibited when winds exceed 10 mph, during a Fire Weather Watch, Red Flag Warnings or when prohibited by local, State, or Federal agencies having jurisdiction. Please check with local fire agencies having jurisdiction for burn restrictions.
- Open burning and outdoor fires are prohibited in certain areas of San Bernardino County or require a permit such as agricultural or residential vegetation burning, bonfires, recreational burning, portable outdoor fireplaces, BBQ pits, BBQ's, open fires conducted while filming and public fireworks displays. Contact the Office of the Fire Marshal or visit [www.sbcfire.org/outdoorfiresafety](http://www.sbcfire.org/outdoorfiresafety) for burning restrictions or obtaining a Special Event permit.
- This ordinance does not cover State Responsibility Areas (SRA) or Federally Protected Lands. For restriction and permitting requirements, check with CalFire within SRA, the U.S. Forest Service (USFS) within the Angeles and San Bernardino National Forests, or the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) within outlying desert regions.
- AQMD burn day status does not authorize burning within SBCFPD jurisdiction during Fire Marshal suspensions.

**Unlawful fires may result in administrative or legal action against the person kindling the fire and/or the owner of the property on which the fire occurs.**
