



Disposal of Auto-injectors

The San Bernardino County Fire - Household Hazardous Waste Section is **NOT** accepting auto-injectors unless residents bring in the auto-injector components separately.

Separate Hazardous Components can include but not limited to the following:

- Medication

-Circuit Board

Gas Cylinder/cartridge

-Batteries

Needles are properly packed in a sharp's container



Residents should <u>contact their pharmacy and/or Auto-injector manufacturer</u> for disposal. Due to all the different hazardous components, these auto-injectors <u>SHALL NOT</u> be placed in the trash and <u>CANNOT</u> be placed in the sharps containers.



Residents can drop off these hazardous components at HHW Sites <u>if separated</u> and needles are in an approved Bio-Hazard/rigid container w/ label.

The only items allowed to be packed in an approved container are:

- NEEDLES
- LANCETS
- Syringes with a needle attached that must be completely spent
 - (used and no liquid remaining, this includes EpiPens)
