## Large commercial fire in Adelanto is knocked down after destroying two buildings **Gregory Yee, LOS ANGELES TIMES**

A large fire at a commercial yard in Adelanto destroyed two buildings, including a former fire station, on

Wednesday as **San Bernardino County firefighters** battled intense flames and other hazards. Numerous 911 callers reported hearing explosions and seeing flames around 4:35 p.m. in the area of Baldwin

Street and Hardy Avenue, said Mike McClintock, a battalion chief with the county Fire Protection District.

"Crews arrived to find a large commercial yard well involved with fire," McClintock said. "Multiple exposures, including a strip mall, multiple homes and old Fire Station 321, were threatened by the large fire."

Firefighters worked to keep the flames from spreading to the neighboring buildings while also working away from downed power lines at the scene, he said.

"Due to the large fire and threats, a second alarm was quickly requested," McClintock said. "Limited water supply and downed power lines hampered firefighting efforts."

Crews knocked down the blaze at 7:30 p.m., he said. Two buildings were destroyed, including the former fire station. A landscaping company also suffered losses to its products and yard, but firefighters were able to keep the blaze from spreading to a nearby strip mall and homes.

Southern California Edison crews were called to handle the downed power lines, McClintock said. No one was injured by the fire.

Units from the Victorville Fire Department and Apple Valley Fire Protection District also responded to the blaze, he said.

### San Bernardino Fire Crews Knockdown Massive Commercial Fire In Adelanto

ADELANTO (CBSLA) – **San Bernardino County Fire** crews were able to knockdown a major two-alarm commercial fire in Adelanto Wednesday evening.

Authorities said the fire crews responded to the large commercial blaze in the 18000 block of Baldwin Street at around 4:35 p.m. Wednesday and went into defensive mode to protect other nearby homes and a strip mall center.

Officials said they think the fire started at a nursery on Baldwin Street. There were reportedly several explosions, possibly from propane tanks used at the business where the fire raged.

About 50 firefighters were called out to manage the blaze. No injuries were reported, and fire damage did not extend to any homes or the neighboring strip mall.

Two buildings, including former fire station, lost to two-alarm blaze in Adelanto

A fire at a commercial property in Adelanto claimed two structures as it burned Wednesday afternoon and evening, though the San Bernardino County Fire Protection District was able to prevent the blaze from spreading to other structures.

The two-alarm Baldwin Fire, located in the 18100 block of Baldwin Street, destroyed two buildings, including the old Fire Station 321, "which served the area for many years," according to a news release from Battalion Chief Mike McClintock.

Additionally, a nearby agricultural supply company "sustained heavy losses to their products and yard," McClintock said.

"Despite heavy fire conditions, power lines down and a limited water supply firefighters were successful in keeping the fire from spreading to a nearby strip mall and homes," McClintock said.

There were no injuries during the more than three hours it took firefighters to gain control over the fire.

The San Bernardino County firefighters, who responded with six engines, two truck companies and a heavy equipment team, among other personnel, were joined by representatives of the Victorville and Apple Valley fire departments, McClintock said.

The San Bernardino County Fire Department reported a two-alarm fire Wednesday night in Adelanto.

County Fire officials reported that at 4:34 p.m. that evening, they received a call about the blaze in a commercial yard in the 18100 block of Baldwin Street.

The fire was reported in a residential neighborhood north of Bartlett Avenue in Adelanto and west of the Southern California Logistics Airport located in Victorville.

The Apple Valley Fire Protection District and Victorville Fire Department were called to assist and Southern California Edison was called to repair power lines, county fire said.

Firefighters were working to protect nearby structures, and downed power lines and a limited supply of water posed challenges, the county reported.

A column of heavy black smoke could be seen miles away, according to residents, who also said they heard loud explosions after the fire began.

A local real estate broker that night, posted on Facebook that two structures on Bartlett Avenue were also on fire.

Just before 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, county fire reported that the "Baldwin Fire" was knocked down, with no extension to adjacent homes or a strip mall. Firefighters will remain on scene.
