Amboy, California: A crash involving an overturned vehicle has occurred along Kelbaker Road just south of Interstate 40.

The crash was reported at around 12:26 p.m. PT on Friday, January 14th, 2022 in the area of 20320-20981 Kelbaker Road approximately 5 miles just south of Interstate 40.

Initial reports from the California Highway Patrol reports an unknown type small sedan overturned, x-ray out of vehicle and fell down.

Medical Engine 44 from **San Bernardino County Fire** District as well as MBA 5 (Morongo Basin Ambulance) is responding.

A Tow Truck towing service has been called to the incident.

As of 1:27 p.m. PT, Comm-Center tells Medical Engine 44 to cancel response, but MBA 5 (Morongo Basin Ambulance) is still responding.

As of 1:30 p.m. PT, Comm-Center tells Medical Engine 44 that MBA 5 (Morongo Basin Ambulance) is on scene and can handle.

At this moment, no further updates on the condition of the driver in the overturned crash.

California Highway Patrol is reporting that the cab of the semi truck is upright but the trailer is overturned in the center divider.

Medical Engine 32 from **San Bernardino County Fire** District as well as Medical Ambulance 31A are responding.

As of 5:57 p.m. PT, A&G Towing has been called to the scene.

As of 5:57 p.m. PT, Medical Ambulance 31A telling Comm-Center that they've been cancelled by California Highway Patrol on scene, reports of no injuries.

## Building fire in Adelanto leads to pot bust; 2 arrested

The fire that destroyed an old fire station along with materials from a business has turned into much more than a 2-alarm fire that had fire crews from county fire, Apple Valley and Victorville.

Police now say they have made some arrests and found evidence of "manufacturing a controlled substance" and "possession of cannabis for sale."

To recap from an earlier report, members of the **San Bernardino County Fire** Department responded to reports of a commercial building on fire in the 11700 block of Bartlett Avenue in the City of Adelanto. The business is called Johnson Solar. Upon arrival, officials found a building fully engulfed in flames and quickly growing, threatening neighboring structures such as the old fire station which was later destroyed, a strip mall and a duplex.

The surrounding area was evacuated, and surface streets closed as a large contingent of fire crews fought the blaze for nearly 3 hours. The fire caused disruption to utility services for the surrounding neighborhood and businesses.

Police sent in its Bomb/Arson Team to assist in the investigation. Once the fire was put out, investigators located evidence of a butane extraction lab and a large quantity of processed marijuana at the scene. As a result, The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, Marijuana Enforcement Team responded to process the scene. Over the course of the investigation, investigators recovered large amounts of processed and concentrated cannabis, a marijuana extraction system, cash and two ghost guns.

2 people were arrested. Peng Wei and Jing Wei Ping were arrested for Health and possession of cannabis for sale and a violation for manufacturing a controlled substance. The case will be forwarded to the District Attorney's Office for review.

No word from authorities as of yet if they believe that a transformer did in fact spark the initial fire as first reported from eyewitnesses or if it might have been some explosion from the manufacturing of cannabis.

## Fire breaks out in large apartment complex in Upland

A fire broke out at a large apartment complex and damaged eight units in Upland on Monday afternoon, Jan. 17, authorities said.

The fire was reported just after 1 p.m. at 1580 W. Eighth St. on the corner of Benson Avenue. Smoke and flames were coming out of a two-story apartment building and fire crews learned that both floors of the building and an attic space had become involved in fire, the **San Bernardino County Fire Department** said on Twitter.

No victims were located during the search of the complex, said the Fire Department in a news release.

The fire was extinguished shortly after 3 p.m., the Fire Department said. The fire's origin was under investigation.

Four units sustained smoke and fire damage while the remaining four received smoke and water damage, the Fire Department said.

The Ontario Fire Department, the Rancho Cucamonga Fire Protection District and the Chino Valley Independent Fire District assisted with the incident, the county Fire Department said.

The American Red Cross was on scene to assist the displaced residents, the Fire Department said. The exact number of residents receiving services was not immediately available, said Christine Welch, spokeswoman with the American Red Cross.

“The Red Cross is working to provide food, shelter, health services, and more, for those who were displaced by the fire,” Welch said.
